Uniforms

Forest Crescent Uniform Shop is run by volunteers.

Open fortnightly on a Wednesday morning between 8.45-9.45am, orders can be placed by printing the order form from the school website, placing your form in the box in the front office or by coming to the Uniform Shop in person.

School Banking

Through the program, students develop strong financial literacy skills by learning how to set goals and make regular savings to achieve these goals.

Sports

The Sports Committee is run by the school's sports teacher and meets several times a year to discuss and organise the school sports carnivals and sports activities.

The Committee supports the organisation of the day's events and the required help from volunteers to help run the activities smoothly.

The Committee is also responsible for organising and recommending to the P&C any required funding for events, sports equipment or clothing.

Fundraising

The Fundraising Committee helps raise money to cover the extra costs of running the Primary School.

The fundraising efforts of the school community have been used to buy new equipment and resources for the Primary School. The committee is always looking for new ideas and ways to approach fundraising.

Safety House Committee

The Safety House Committee administers the Safety House Program in the Forest Lakes area on behalf of the Safety House Association of WA.

Identifying and engaging prospective householders, the committee coordinates the relevant security checks and participant responsibilities of being a safety house.

The committee also promotes the Safety House program during Safety House Week.

Road Safety Committee

The Road Safety Committee's role is to work with the school administration and the City of Gosnells to make the roads around the school safer for our children.

Book Club

The Forest Crescent P&C coordinates the ordering and distribution of Book Club each term.

The books and materials offered for purchase by students enhances the reading and general education of each participating child, while also delivering rewards to the whole school community in the form of resource materials.

Canteen

Management of the Forest Crescent Primary School Canteen is co-ordinated by the P&C and helps raise vital funds in support of the school.

Volunteer support from across the school community helps in the daily operations of the canteen which provides a range of food options in line with the Healthy Food and Drink Policy. Parents, relatives and community members are encouraged to support and assist this important element of the school.

Grounds

The Grounds Committee meets on a scheduled basis with the School Principal, to inspect the school grounds both internally and externally and plan for future improvements.
