### FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK



Greetings to students, parents, staff and 属 community members and welcome to this edition of the newsletter. It has been another busy fortnight at Forest Crescent with lots of teaching and learning coming to a conclusion as we start to transition all students to their new year level for 2024. I have been proud of the students behaviour throughout this term, with Behaviour Management Pink Slips and entries in the classroom behaviour books being kept to a minimum. look forward the positive behaviour to continuing for the remainder of the term.

**PEAC Testing:** Primary Extension and Challenge (PEAC) is a part time supplementary program for students in Years 5 and 6. Students are identified as suited to participation in the PEAC Program through testing in Year 4. All public school students in Year 4 are provided with the opportunity to be assessed for suitability for the PEAC Parents may request that their child be program. excluded from the testing process by notifying the school in writing. The Gifted and Talented Selection Unit in Central Office is responsible for coordinating the state-wide test schedule, compiling and distributing test materials and disseminating student results through Regional Offices. Regional Assessment Coordinators manage and coordinate test material distribution, collation, record-keeping and the return of answer sheets for on behalf of schools. The tests marking were

developed in 2016 by the Australian Council for Education Research (ACER). The marking, scoring and data management for 2023 was completed by Pearson Australia. Test administration is conducted by school staff and this year demonstrated once again the high standards of teachers undertaking an important role in this state-wide assessment Regions are responsible for managing the pool of students identified as suitable to PEAC through the test process, with each selected student meeting defined criteria.

A total of 23,628 (of 25,880) students participated in the 2023 PEAC assessment between the 31 July and 30 August 2010. 2 students from Forest Crescent were successful in gaining offers for PEAC in Year 5 2024! Congratulations to Eli C, and Ashton S. There were also 19 students who scored above the 80<sup>th</sup> percentile. One of our focus areas to be planned for in 2024 is to continue to provide more opportunities for our Gifted and Talented students!

**School Board:** All parents were emailed a nomination letter for our School Board 2024 – 25 as an attachment to previous newsletters. There were 2 nominations received and therefore no election is necessary. I would like to congratulate and thank Aaron Hayes and Jack Wilmot on their successful appointment to the board, joining Peter Massey and Kelly Ibbitson as your parent representatives for 2024/25. There is still one vacant position that the board will look to fill before the first meeting in Week 4 Term 1.

**Pre Kindergarten Session:** Our Pre-Kindergarten program for 2023 is now running for our 2024 Kindy students. Our Pre-kindy program provides an opportunity for families to get used to our school, and also for us to familiarise ourselves with students and their families prior the commencement of the new school year. A big thank you to all the parents who came along, it was an enjoyable morning with mat time, some fun activities and a story to finish. Thank you to Mrs Whitney and Mrs Tania James who is coordinating our Pre-Kindy program.

**Interschool Athletics:** Good luck to all of our students who will be competing today, representing our school. I am sure that all of our students will compete to their best and display outstanding sportsmanship. Thank you to Mrs Horan, Miss Sandhu and Mrs Sellick and for preparing our students to perform.

**Presentation Evening:** This year our Presentation evening will have some minor changes. The Presentation evening will be held on Wednesday 6 December. This is our major whole school event which signals a conclusion to our year of school and provides our school community with an opportunity to celebrate each year's success, and farewell our Year 6 students. For 2023 we will be trialling Year Level performances only, with no speeches or Book Awards. A Book Award Assembly will be held on Friday 8 December in the undercover area from 2pm - 3pm. This is to reduce the length of the evening to allow all students to stay for the evening without the necessity for an intermission. Current planning has the evening commencing at 6pm, with students being seated from 5.45pm with the evening to conclude no later than 8pm. Year level items will also be moved around however the evenina will conclude with our Year 6 students and the whole school song. All students are expected to stay for the duration of the evening. We look forward to your support as we trial this format for 2023.

Year 6 Camp: Last week I spent a couple of days (and nights!) with the Year 6 students and staff at their camp at Woodman Point. The camp experience was been very positive with the students participating in a variety of challenging and team building activities. To take 82 students away for a week is a huge undertaking and I would like to sincerely thank the staff and parent helpers for their willingness to attend camp and provide the Year 6 students with an invaluable experience outside of the normal school setting. All graduating students are to be dressed in smart attire in the theme of black and white. Parents are invited to attend the ceremony to see the awards presentation, graduation proceedings and short presentation from the Year 6 students. The second part of the evening for the students is a Dinner Dance at Gosnells Golf Club. Students will travel there by bus and parents are to pick them up from the golf club at 9:30pm. Semester Two Reports: Parents will be provided with a link on Connect to access their child's report on Friday 8 December. This report is based on the work your child has covered throughout the year. It shows their final achievement of the expected standard for each year level. Since the Western Australian Curriculum aims to challenge students, a C or Satisfactory Achievement rating (achievement of the standard) is one to celebrate! Teachers also provide comments for English and Mathematics and it is important to read these in the context of their achievement level. Please take time to read through the report with your child and discuss points for celebration as well as any points for improvement in 2024. If you have any concerns, please follow up with your child's classroom teacher before the conclusion of the term.
