FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK

Greetings to parents, staff, students and community members and welcome to this edition of the school newsletter. It is amazing that we head into Week 9 next week, with under a fortnight until the Easter holiday break. It has been a busy fortnight with many activities happening around the school, culminating in the end of NAPLAN testing. I would like to thank the school community for your continued support ensuring that your kids are ready for learning each day, turning up with a smile, ready to do their best. I look forward to a busy but productive end of the term.

Please see the following article that was placed in the first newsletter sent home on the 2 Feb this year. I thank all community members who ensure the safety of our students and abide by the current school policies. A reminder about the school expectations when students and parents arrive before 8.30am has been placed on all gates. The Before School Policy has been endorsed by the School Board and the P&C.

Before and After School: Our school's policy is that students should not be arriving prior to 8.30am as adequate teacher supervision cannot be guaranteed. Students who do arrive early are directed to the Undercover Area where supervision will be provided from 8.00am. Prior to this time,

there may be no-one to supervise children. When Parents are accompanying children during this time, they too, are asked to assemble in the Undercover Area, and not outside classrooms or on the playground. From 8.30am, all gates will be opened and class teachers will be in their room, ready to assume Duty of Care for their students. Parent support is required as the safety of your children is extremely important to us. When children arrive at school (after 8.30am) they should go directly to their classroom. The 8.30am - 8.45am period is used for children to prepare for the morning lessons. Outside play is not permitted during this time. At the end of the school day, children should not remain at school after being dismissed nor play on the equipment as, again, adequate teacher supervision cannot be guaranteed. NAPLAN Testing: Students in Years 3 and 5 have really settled into the National assessment in Literacy and Numeracy to be completed from Wednesday 13 March to Monday 25 March (week 7/8 Term 1). At FCPS we support students to be as well prepared as possible to perform their best during the testing period by viewing the NAPLAN program as part of our normal teaching and learning program. This year all students will be sitting NAPLAN Online (except Year 3 writing will still be written) so students will be completing an online demonstration test during their library time to ensure that they are familiar with the testing environment. An information leaflet has been sent home to all students in Years 3 and 5 who will be sitting the tests. Well done to all students who have sat the first couple of tests this week.

Ramadan: This week marked the beginning of the Holy Month of Ramadan. Currently we have 64 students (almost 10%) of our student population of Muslim Faith. It is important for our school to support all students, but it is especially important to provide extra support to those students who may be fasting. Below is an article providing our school community with information about Ramadan: Muslims around the globe will begin observing the holy month of Ramadan from Tuesday 12th March until Tuesday 9 April, a period of deep spiritual reflection and celebration.





The month of Ramadan will see Muslims fast and pray before breaking their fast at sundown alongside family and friends. Ramadan is the most sacred month of the year for Muslims. It remembers the month the Qur'an was first revealed to the Prophet Mohammed. During its 29 to 30 days. Muslims abstain from food and drink every day from dawn to sunset — yes, even water. When the sun sets, there is a communal meal called lftar, where you break your fast, usually with your family or friends. Traditionally, Muslims break their fast by eating dates to emulate how the Prophet Mohammed broke his fast. But the month of Ramadan is about more than just fasting. You are also encouraged to do good deeds such as charity and abstain from sinful gossip. Ît's acts such as also **a** month self-reflection and a way for Muslims to develop positive habits that can be brought forward once Ramadan is over.

P&C AGM: The P&C held their AGM on Wednesday 13 March. It was great to see a large turnout of parents at the P&C (18 members) and all executive positions filled. Kindergarten 2025: Kindergarten enrolments are now being taken for 2025. If you have a child who was born between 1 July 2020 - 30 June 2021 they are eligible to commence Kindy in 2025.

Enrolment application forms can be found on our website (https://forestcrescentps.com/school-information/enrolment _details/) or you can call through the office to collect.

To commence your application we will need to see the following documents:

- Original Birth Certificate,
- Immunisation History Statement no more than 2 months old with a status of 'up to date' (from MYGOV website)
- Proof of residence (electricity bill, rates notes, rental agreement)

Please note if you are on a visa we will also need to see this and your passport as part of your application. Kindergarten Enrolment being non-compulsory does not follow the local intake policy, ie all local students are guaranteed a place, however all students who live within a local school intake area will be accommodated where possible.

Should enrolments exceed available placements then the following criteria will apply:

Basically, the ranking is as follows:

- Students living within the local school intake area with siblings at the school
- Students living within the local school intake area without siblings at the school
- Students living outside the local school intake area with siblings at the school
- 4. Students living outside the local school intake area without siblings at the school

Only applications received before the closing date will be considered as above. **Applications close on Friday 19 July 2024.**

Dogs on School Premises: Just a reminder that dogs are not permitted on school grounds unless they are part of a school event or an authorised assisted dog. The school grounds are designated by the boundary fences. As a shared facility, dogs are allowed on the oval during both drop off and pick up times, however it is requested that you keep your dogs on a lead to avoid them approaching students. Where dogs may be briefly tied to the boundary school fence it is also requested that they are not near the entrance gates to the school. While I acknowledge that the majority of dogs love to be patted and have extra attention, some stunts may be anxious around dogs. Your cooperation is most appreciated.
