The mission is for students in kindergarten to Year 10 to read 12 books over 4 months from 6 May to

6 September. That's right—just 12, students can read:

- books
- short stories
- graphic novels
- eBooks
- talking books
- audiobooks
- Poems
- anything that sparks their interest and gets them reading.

Benefits of the challenge

The challenge will:

- raise the profile of reading and literacy in schools
- give students a focus for their reading
- encourage students to enjoy reading and read more books
- encourage students to participate by being challenged
- offer incentives and prizes for readers
- build self-esteem, pride, school unity and a sense of achievement among students
- increase the involvement of parents in their child's reading
- increase the number of library books borrowed
- contribute to increased literacy levels.

Prizes for participation

- Students will go in the draw to win amazing weekly prizes. With more than 110 prizes drawn at random from those who log at least one book per week during the challenge. Find out more about the <u>Premier's</u> <u>Reading Challenge prizes</u>.
- Schools that have the most students registered relative to their size before 31 May will go into a draw to win an assembly presentation of the Dewey Experience at your school!

How to register: Create an account by selecting the 'Sign up' option. You won't be able to log any books until the 2024 challenge starts on 6 May.

Kindergarten 2025: Kindergarten enrolments are now being taken for 2025. If you have a child who was born between 1 July 2020 - 30 June 2021 they are eligible to commence Kindy in 2025.

Enrolment application forms can be found on our website (<u>https://forestcrescentps.com/school-information/enrolment</u>_<u>-details/</u>) or you can call through the office to collect.

To commence your application we will need to see the following documents:

- Original Birth Certificate,
- Immunisation History Statement no more than 2 months old with a status of 'up to date' (from MYGOV website)
- Proof of residence (electricity bill, rates notes, rental agreement)

Please note if you are on a visa we will also need to see this and your passport as part of your application. Kindergarten Enrolment being non-compulsory does not follow the local intake policy, ie all local students are guaranteed a place, however all students who live within a local school intake area will be accommodated where possible. Should enrolments exceed available placements then the following criteria will apply:

Basically, the ranking is as follows:

- 1. Students living within the local school intake area with siblings at the school
- 2. Students living within the local school intake area without siblings at the school
- Students living outside the local school intake area with siblings at the school
- 4. Students living outside the local school intake area without siblings at the school

Only applications received before the closing date will be considered as above. Applications close on Friday 19 July 2024.

Kiss and Drive: The Kiss and Drive provides parents and students from Years 1 to 6 with a quick and convenient way of dropping off and picking up. Thank you to all of the parents who use the Kiss and Drive area appropriately, following the rules of the zone and not parking in these designated bays. I have noticed a vast improvement in the correct use of the Kiss and Drive area since the City of Gosnells remarked the bays. I would like to thank the City of Gosnells for completing the line marking, it has greatly enhanced this area, making it easier for everyone to notice the Kiss and Drive area.
