### FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK

Greetings to staff, students, parent and community members and welcome to the first edition of the school newsletter for Term 4. Apologies that the newsletter is a week late, it was supposed to be out last week, but the first fortnight really got away being super busy! Term 4 promises to be a very busy term with many teaching and learning opportunities happening across the school. The Term 4 planner has been sent home and also published on the school website. Please keep it handy as it outlines all of the events this term. I look forward to catching up with many parents over the coming term during our events and happenings.

Year 6 Camp: I have just spent the last three days down at Woodman Point with the Year 6 students and staff participating in their Year 6 Camp. We took 85 students, 8 staff and 2 parent helpers for a week long camp. I would like to first acknowledge the commitment of the staff – Mrs Davies, Miss Sandhu, Mrs Brown, Miss Doran, Mrs Bransby, Mrs Kinsella and Mrs Craven and parent helpers Mrs Ibbitson and Mr Booth. There are not many primary schools who commit to a 5 day camp and while we were at Woodman Point we had a school commence Monday and left Wednesday morning and then another school come in on Wednesday lunchtime and were leaving the same time as us on Friday. Thank you staff for being on duty 24/7 with eighty-five Year 6 students!

The students were also amazing and participated in a full on activity week commencing at 7.00am getting organised for breakfast until 10.00pm when lights out. Their efforts in all activities and working together as a team meant many student overcame some fears, especially height completing the Flying Fox, sleeping away from home for the first time or trying new foods. I must say that it was one of the most enjoyable group of students to be on camp with as Principal and thank you as parents for supporting your kids coming to camp.

Class lists: Staff have commenced developing class lists for 2025. As the school structure is still in draft, and will be right up until the start of 2025, class placements will not be advertised until the office reopens towards the end of January. I have received some parent requests that will be taken into consideration, when placing students in classes, based on educational grounds. As per previous years, classes will be formulated according to the following:

- mixed ability classes spread of IEP / SAER students;
- behaviour management class dynamics;
- gender balance where possible;
- friendship groups try for at least 3 peer friends.

School Photos: Photo order forms were handed out in Week 10, Thursday, 19th September, for all families. Kindy 1A and 2A forms were handed out in Week 1, Tuesday 8th October. Students who haven't received a photo order form (if you are new to the school in the last few weeks) can get one from the front office. Complete the form and hand it to your child's teacher on the morning of class Photo Day (see the schedule on the school website). Students will hand their forms over to the photographers on Photo Day. Please return the form regardless of whether you are ordering prints or not. Keep your forms safe. Spare forms are available at the front office but are limited in number.

### On Photo Day, Could Parents:

- Please ensure your child has returned the Order Form.
- Advise your child that 3P will be taking photos today.
- Please ensure the correct and neat uniform is worn.
- Their hair is neat. Preferably, no large side/high ponytails; it may be cropped out.

### Sibling Photos:

- Sibling Photos will be taken in the photography area at the school (Undercover Area-Tuesday, Wednesday & Thursday morning), with sibling photo times being before school, 8:15-8:45am (Tuesday, Wednesday) and 8:00-8:45am (Thursday), and after school, 3:00-3:15pm (Tuesday and Wednesday) THERE IS NO SIBLING PHOTO SESSION ON THURSDAY AFTER SCHOOL.
- Please note that students will not be collected from class.
- Students must present themselves in the photography area-undercover area.
- Order only on the eldest child's form unless ordering multiple sibling packs.

Forest Crescent Primary Choir, Band, TAGS ART, and TAGS DRAMA are scheduled for Tuesday, 29<sup>th</sup> October, with class and graduation photos taken from Tuesday to Thursday.

**Swimming:** Swimming is happening from 4<sup>th</sup> November to 15<sup>th</sup> November. The schedule for in-term swimming lessons for our Pre-Primary to Year 3 students is found on our website. The parent information letter provides more information about swimming lessons. The website provides details of times and whether your child's class has different recess or lunchtime breaks. Apologies for the lateness in sending the permission forms, and a BIG thank you to parents who have returned them by 25<sup>th</sup> October; it does help so much with the organisation.

Before and After School: Our school's policy is that students should not be arriving prior to 8.30am as adequate teacher supervision cannot be guaranteed. Students who do arrive early are directed to the Undercover Area where supervision will be provided from 8.00am. Prior to this time, there may be no-one to supervise children. When parents are accompanying children during this time, they too, are asked to assemble in the Undercover Area, and not outside classrooms. From 8.30am, all gates will be opened and class teachers will be in their room, ready to assume Duty of Care for their students. Parent support is required as the safety of your children is extremely important to us. When children arrive at school (after 8.30am) they should go directly to their classroom. The 8.30am - 8.45am period is used for children to prepare for the morning lessons. Outside play permitted during this time. At the end of the school day, children should not remain at school after being dismissed nor play on the equipment as, again, adequate teacher supervision cannot be guaranteed. Pre Kindergarten Session: Our Pre-Kindergarten program for 2024 commences next Wednesday 30 October for our 2025 Kindy students. Our Pre-kindy program provides an opportunity for families to get used to our school, and also for us to familiarise ourselves with students and their families prior the commencement of the new school year. A big thank you to all the parents who came along, it was an enjoyable morning with mat time, some fun activities and a story to finish. Thank you to Mrs Whitney who is coordinating our Pre-Kindy program.

Concert Evening: This year our end of year concert will run similar to last year being streamlined to ensure that it doesn't run for more than 90 minutes. The evening will be held on Monday 2 December. This is our major whole school event which signals a conclusion to our year of school and provides our school community with an opportunity to celebrate each year's success, and farewell our Year 6 students. A Book Award Assembly will be held on Friday 6 December in the undercover area from 9.00am - 10.30am (including the presentation of incoming Student Councillors). This is to reduce the length of the evening to allow all students to stay for the evening without the necessity for an intermission. Current planning has the evening commencing at 6pm, with students being seated from 5.45pm with the evening to conclude no later than 8pm. Year level items will also be moved around however the evening will conclude with our Year 6 students and the whole school song. All students are expected to stay for the duration of the evening.

Year 6 Graduation: This celebration will take place on Monday 9th December. The Year 6 graduation consists of two parts. The formal ceremony will take place in front of the undercover area. The ceremony will start at 5:20pm and will conclude at 6:50pm. We ask that your child arrive by 5:10pm for a punctual start. All graduating students are to be dressed in smart attire in the theme of black and white. Parents are invited to attend the ceremony to see the awards presentation, graduation proceedings and short presentation from the Year 6 students. The second part of the evening for the students is a Dinner Dance at Gosnells Golf Club. Students will travel there by bus and parents are to pick them up from the golf club at 9:30pm. We ask that all parents are punctual at this time. I look forward to sharing the last formal school event with a wonderful group of students who have represented our school over a number of years. A permission note will be sent home next week.

Semester Two Reports: Parents will be provided with a link on Connect to access their child's report Friday 6 December. This report is based on the work your child has covered throughout the year. It shows their final achievement of the expected standard for each year level. Since the Western Australian Curriculum aims to challenge students, a C or Satisfactory Achievement rating (achievement of the standard) is one to celebrate! Teachers also provide comments for English and Mathematics and it is important to read these in the context of their achievement level. Please take time to read through the report with your child and discuss points for celebration as well as any points for improvement in 2025. If you have any concerns, please follow up with your child's classroom teacher before the conclusion of the term.


