FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK

Greetings to students, parents, staff and community members and welcome to the last edition of the newsletter for 2024. It has been another busy fortnight at Forest Crescent with lots of teaching and learning programs coming to a conclusion as we start to transition all students to their new year level for 2024. The year is quickly coming to a close, but we still have lots to do! Student reports have been finalised and all classes are preparing for our Concert Night which will be held next Monday 2nd December and our Book Awards Assembly on Friday 6 December. I have been proud of the students' behaviour throughout this term, with Behaviour Management Pink Slips and entries in the classroom behaviour books being kept to a minimum. I look forward to the positive behaviour continuing for the remainder of the term.

School Board: We held our final School Board meeting for 2024 last Wednesday. I would like to sincerely thank our School Board Members – Chair Peter Massey, Paul Swanson, Jack Wilmot, Kelly Ibbitson, Aaron Hayes, Jane Rankine, Tenille Nowell, Joanna Whitney and ex officio

Donna Caniglia for their contribution to the governance of Forest Crescent as written in the 2023 Public School Review "An informed Board and a dynamic P&C, work collaboratively with the Principal to contribute significantly to the school's ongoing improvement." I would like to make special mention of Peter Massey who after initially starting on the School Council in 2012 became Chair of the Board in 2018 and has been chair ever since. Peter's last child is graduating from Forest Crescent and therefore is no longer eligible to be a parent board member in 2025. On behalf of the FCPS school community I would like to offer my sincere thanks and wish you all the best as you and your children move on through their educational journey. I would also like to acknowledge Jack Wilmot who also has children leaving school after an 11 year association with Forest Crescent (and 7 years on the Board!). Thank you for your contribution to Forest Crescent Jack! This has created a 1 year vacancy on the board for 2025. As per the constitution, we have just had an election with our 3 vacant positions for 2025 being filled by Kelly Ibbitson and Dr Joshua McCann (for 2025/26) and Verginia Serdev-Patterson for the remainder of Jack's term 2025. We welcome both Joshua and Verginia to the School Board in 2025.

Our band consists of nearly 50 students playing 7 different instruments — clarinet, flute, guitar, trombone, trumpet, baritone and drums and they played magnificently. As part of the arts curriculum students get the opportunity to participate in music, visual arts, drama, choir and band!

Fathering Project: Last Friday evening we held our annual Fathering Project Big Camp Out - and it was BIG! Mr Albert as our Fathering Project Dads Group coordinator said " Thank you to the Dads, Father figure's and kids for the awesome time at the Fathering Project Big Camp Out on Friday night. I would also like to give a BIG SHOUT OUT to Mr Albert who is the coordinator of the Forest Crescent Dads Group who ensured the evening was a great success. Concert Evening: The concert evening will be held on Monday 2 December. This is our major whole school event which signals a conclusion to our year of school and provides our school community with an opportunity to celebrate each year's success, and farewell our Year 6 students. There will be Year Level performances only, with no speeches or Book Awards. A Book Award Assembly will be held on Friday 6 December in the undercover area from 8.45am - 10.30am. This is to reduce the length of the evening to allow all students to stay for the evening without the necessity for an intermission. Current planning for Monday 2 December is students will need to be at their classrooms by 5.45pm with the evening commencing at 6pm. Year level items will also be moved around however the evening will conclude with our Year 6 students and the whole school song. All students are expected to stay for the duration of the evening. The Concert Evening will conclude no later than 7.30pm.

Forest Crescent Pay it Forward: As I have said at numerous assemblies and community events, I have never been at a school that is so giving. Even when we are experiencing a cost of living crisis we are giving so much – thank you! In the last week we have helped donate necessary pet items to assist the charity GOSAC – Give our Strays a Chance, which is a not for profit organisation which is coordinated by Dean an ex Forest Crescent student who started his charity as Year 6 Student as part of his extension and Challenge program.

Dean and his dog Otis came to school last week to pick up the donations. Over a 12 year period Dean and GO-SAC have raised over 4 million dollars! Thank you to Mrs James and the kindy for coordinating this charity. Yesterday we had FoodBank come to school to collect the food items we had donated. Mrs Martin and the Year 1 staff coordinated this charity and we donated over 380 kilograms of food and staples to FoodBank for those less fortunate than ourselves over the Christmas break. Today the Year 6 students and staff are coordinating the Kids4Kids fun day where all students from P-6 come out to participate in a variety of fun games and activities. Money raised today will go to the Stitch In Time Charity to support Youth Mental Health Programs. Thank you to our amazing community.

Book Award Assembly: The Book Award Assembly will be our formal awards ceremony to be held on Friday 6 December commencing at 8.45am in the undercover area. Parents of Book Award recipients will be notified by Miss Sandhu. The announcement of Head Boy, Head Girl, Student Councillors and Faction Captains will also be announced during the assembly together with the Head Boy and Head Girl end of year speech.

Year 6 Graduation: This celebration will take place on Monday 9th December. The Year 6 graduation consists of two parts. The formal ceremony will take place in our undercover area. The ceremony will start at 5:25pm and will conclude at approximately 6:50pm. We ask that your child arrive by 5:15pm for a punctual start. All graduating students are to be dressed in smart attire in the theme of black and white. Parents are invited to attend the ceremony to see the awards presentation, graduation proceedings and short presentation from the Year 6 students. The second part of the evening for the students is a Dinner Dance at Gosnells Golf Club. Students will travel there by bus and parents are to pick them up from the golf club at 9:30pm. We ask that all parents are punctual at this time. I look forward to sharing the last formal school event with a wonderful group of students who have represented our school over a number of years.

Semester Two Reports: Parents will be able to access their child's report on Friday 6 December through the Connect App. This report is based on the work your child has covered throughout the year. It shows their final achievement of the expected standard for each year level. Since the Western Australian Curriculum aims to challenge students, a C or Satisfactory Achievement rating (achievement of the standard) is one to celebrate! Teachers also provide comments for English and Mathematics and it is important to read these in the context of their achievement level. Please take time to read through the report with your child and discuss points for celebration as well as any points for improvement in 2025. If you have any concerns, please follow up with your child's classroom teacher before the conclusion of the term.

Aussie of The Month Lunch: Congratulations to the final Citizens of the Month recipients from our last assembly. They will join other Semester 2 Citizens of The Month for a special lunch with myself on Wednesday 4 December in the staffroom. The Citizen of the Month Award is a significant award for students to be awarded at Forest Crescent, and I would like to congratulate all winner this year for your outstanding citizenship and behaviour at school. Class Lists 2025: Class lists have now been completed. All class lists will be on display on Monday 3 February from 12.00pm in the undercover area. Teaching staff committed a great deal of time and effort in developing the classes throughout fourth term 2024 according to the following criteria:

Classes are to be formulated according to the following:

- Mixed ability classes spread of IEP/SAER students.
- Behaviour management class dynamics.
- Gender balance where possible.
- Friendship groups try for at least 3 peer friends.

As has been previously communicated in newsletters, at P&C meetings and School Board meetings, individual requests for moving classes in 2025 will be considered in collaboration with the appropriate staff based on reasonable educational grounds and requests relating to individual staff members will not be considered. The current class structure indicates some year levels are nearing capacity and movement between classes will be quite difficult.

Students returning late in 2025: School commences for students on Wednesday 5 February 2025. The student census, where all students are counted to attract funding from the Student Centred Funding Model, will take place on Friday, 21 February 2025. There are very strict protocols around students we can count and it is important that if students are returning late from the holidays (mainly from overseas) that we have information about the date of return and reason for absence otherwise they will not be included in the census.
