Reporting to Parents

Updates to End-of-Semester Reporting

Last year, the Department of Education clarified the requirements for end-of-semester reports. Schools have since reviewed their practices and updated their formal written reports in line with this guidance.

The Department's requirements are:

- An overall teacher comment must be included, with the content determined by the school.
- Learning area comments are not required.
- Grades at the strand or sub-strand level are not required.

For students with special educational needs, a learning area comment or attachments (e.g. photos) are not required. Reporting instead aligns with the Individual Education Plan (IEP) developed with parents.

From Semester 2, 2025, our school will provide a general teacher comment only in the written reports to parents. We will continue to ensure that comments clearly communicate student progress and achievement, using language that is easy to understand and helpful for parent–teacher conversations throughout the year. Further discussions with staff will shape the content of the general comment, and we will also seek feedback from the Board and wider school community at an appropriate time.

Student Safety

As part of our ongoing commitment to student safety, we will conduct an evacuation drill early next term, and a lockdown drill is scheduled for Term 1 2026.

Creating our classes for 2026

At Forest Crescent Primary School, our staff are committed to meeting the educational needs of every student. Each year, considerable thought, planning, and time goes into placing children into classes. Our goal is always to ensure that every child learns in an environment that is happy, supportive, and productive.

This year, we are introducing *Class Solver*, a specialised class placement tool that helps create well-balanced classes. This practical improvement supports consistent and thoughtful decisions, with student learning and wellbeing at the heart of the process.

Please note that our classes are **not streamed**. Where more than one class exists at a year level, or where a split-grade class is required, the placement of students will be determined through the professional judgement of the Principal, Administration team, and the child's previous teachers.

Privacy & security

Class Solver is Safer Technologies for Schools (ST4S) accredited and SOC 2 Type II audited, which means its privacy and security controls are independently assessed. Student data is hosted in Australia and is accessed only by authorised school staff for the purpose of class placement.

Thank you in anticipation of your support - our goal is the same as yours: classes where every student can thrive academically and socially.

Written Requests

Parents who wish to submit a written request with respect to class placements, based on educational reasons, may address these to "The Principal," marked "Confidential." Please email forestcrescent.ps@education.wa.edu.au.

All written parent submissions, received by **Friday 7 November**, are considered based on individual and school needs. It is important to note that parent/carer communication with the school does not guarantee a particular outcome. Student placement remains a school decision. We do not accept requests for a particular teacher.

Students Not Returning in 2026

Each year families arrive at our school or leave for a variety of reasons. To assist with our planning, we ask that you notify the school office as soon as possible if your child/ren will not be returning in 2026. This does not include our graduating Year 6 students.
